

Additional Terms Derived from the 2020 Further Consolidated Appropriations Act

- The funds cannot be used to pay salaries above \$219,200 annually;
- The funds cannot be used to pay for publicity or lobbying;
- The funds cannot be expended for any abortion or for health benefits coverage that covers abortion, subject to exceptions for rape, incest or to protect the life of the mother. This condition does not apply to the expenditure of private funds by a private person.
- The funds cannot be used to create human embryos for research purposes or for embryo research during which embryos are destroyed or subject to the risk of injury.
- The funds cannot be used to promote the legalization of controlled substances.
- The funds cannot be used to prohibit false scientific information.
- The funds cannot be used to maintain or establish a computer network unless such network blocks the viewing or downloading of pornography.
- The fund cannot be made available to the Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now (ACORN).
- The funds cannot be used to support a needle exchange program except in limited circumstances.
- The fund cannot be used for propaganda or publicity purposes
- The funds cannot be used in contravention of the federal Privacy Act.
- The funds are not available to any entity that requires whistleblowers to sign confidentiality agreements or nondisclosure agreements that are inconsistent with whistleblower laws or laws governing classified government information.
- The funds cannot be used to award a grant or other financial assistance to any organization that has unpaid federal tax liabilities.
- The fund cannot be used to enter into an agreement with any entity that has been convicted of a federal felony within the preceding 24 months.
- Funds cannot be used for the procurement or recapture of wild chimpanzees.
- The award of funds cannot be made to persons or entity involved in sex traffic, procurement of commercial sex acts or forced labor.
- The award is subject to Contractor Employee whistleblower protections of the National defense Authorization Act of 2013
- If the funds are used to support human subject research, recipients must comply with regulations regarding the protection of Human Subject Research.
