

## REPRESENTATIVE ENGAGEMENTS

Representative engagements are divided into our defense of independent contractor “misclassification” lawsuits and administrative proceedings, and independent contractor “compliance” engagements by the co-chairs of Locke Lord’s independent contractor practice.

(These engagements are in addition to our defense of dozens of other lawsuits and administrative proceedings alleging misclassification of employees as exempt from overtime or minimum wage.)

### MISCLASSIFICATION

- defending an au pair sponsor in a putative collective/class action alleging local childcare consultants are misclassified as independent contractors and not paid minimum wages
- defending a courier company in three California class actions alleging the couriers were misclassified as independent contractors and were not paid overtime, minimum wage, and other statutory wage benefits in violation of California Labor Code and Private Attorney Generals Act (PAGA) claims, following the filing of a motion to compel arbitration
